CSA Updates:

Treasurer – Alyson Becker – There is a discrepancy between revenue and expense total because we don't have a house tour this year. There was discussion of changes and explanation of revenue and expenses. Expenses – could increase grant giving this year. Curriculum enrichment – increased to allow more growth. Numbers are all conservative. \$28,000 cushion that should be able to carry us over to the next house tour.

Christine Lear made a motion to approve the 2014-15 Budget.

The 2014-15 Budget was approved.

EVP - Amy Caggiano - New to the process; spoke to the staff on August 27 and told them about CSA. There is a 10/9 deadline for grants, extension following week, then week after that they will meet to review. Secured Liz Mcintosh and Sally Duscha for reviewing applications. Reviewers will also include members of CSA and faculty. Identified who was new to the faculty, sent welcoming message and directed them to the website and Joan Wickman will distribute applications. Teachers are interested and there are examples on the website of what has been done before.

Student Advisory Council – Heidi Kidder coming off the council. Need to find someone if she won't do again, possibly increase term length. Would need a parent of a 5th grader. Emails will go out and everything is on the website.

Secretary – Emily Richardson – Everyone should use gmail addresses for CSA business. Let Emily know if you are experiencing trouble gaining access to gmail account or if email is not forwarding properly.

Membership - Sarah Grallert – There are 69 CSA members as of yesterday. Three or four people are needed to help give out Husky Handbook on back to school night. Alyson Becker and Cary Keller will help. Cost of membership online is a little bit more. Discussion of absorbing the fee to do online transaction.

Husky Handbook – There was discussion of doing extra outreach to preschool and kindergarten families, focusing on Husky Handbook and saving CSA information for later. Ask Claire Wilcox to send a message to new families.

School Supply Kits – Shilpa Goel - Great delivery day. Thank you to all who helped; Doug Hansel was very helpful and all was done in about two hours. There was discussion of purchasing in bulk; teachers will be asked which they prefer. Boxes for individual kits get disposed of right away. Schoolkidz is willing to deliver in bulk.

Fundraising –

Amazon Smile Affinity Program – All of your shopping done through the Amazon Smile click will give the CSA .05% profit. Target is the same. Can't have prime and smile. Affinity programs need more publicity.

Overview of Old Home Day – Suzan Baldoumas – Thank you for helping! 100 kids there. Brought in about the same as last year; need to double the sales if we do again. Look for donations or promote to Concord. \$20 for wrist bands seemed to be the right amount. Numbers for OHD were down this year. Maybe add more tents, shade is needed. Need to identify people to get volunteers to help. Have a representative at each grade level. Will have an event post-mortem to discuss in depth.

Apparel Sale – Dennet would like to do class color t-shirts. Offer sports teams and also be able to buy husky apparel year-round; being a service rather than a fundraiser. Jungle graphics in Ipswich is a great source for t-shirts; they can do anything with great quality and great prices. Ask a graphic designer to make cute t-shirts, maybe run a contest to design the t-shirts.

Services Coordinator - Laura France – Back to School night/CSA fair. Sandy Eisenbies is working on trifolds. Letter to participants will go out today. Hospitality will be next to CSA. Middle school night they just handed out husky handbooks; should have a table at Middle School night.

Publicity - Margo Parent – Run same as last year: reminders sent a week before. Sooner is better for Mosquito. Guidelines went out and didn't hear from anyone with questions. Lots of opportunities for publicity. Last minute additions will not be allowed. If there is something new or different please copy Karina to get information onto the website.

Room Parent Coordinator – Emily DiRocco – If anybody needs the list of room parents it will be put on website and will be in Husky Handbook. There is at least one room parent for Pre-k through 5th grade. Grades 6, 7, and 8 have grade level representatives. Had a difficult time getting the email addresses this year. Emily will work with Dennet to determine best way to manage distribution lists. If you hear of room parents having trouble give feedback to Emily. Change from room parents to reps went to 6th and 7th grade parents. Letter will go next week to 8th grade parents.

VP's of Elementary and Middle Schools:

Amy Versaggi – Everything is going well and they will meet to discuss storage of stuff that is not necessarily grade specific (spaghetti supper, seventh grade play and 8th grade graduation, etc.) There is an area on Curve Street with a storage possibility. Committees have been formed for events.

Cary Keller – There will be some sort of service event – childhood anxiety is a possible topic. Getting feedback; have seminar at a good time in spring. Incorporate a panel to show resources we have available to us. Many of Concord-Carlisle resources available to Carlisle residents, not just Concord.

Curriculum Enrichment – Lisa Chaffin – They are meeting next week; typically same events are done each year, but hope to add some.

New Business

Multicultural festival – Chinese celebration was very successful. Chiao Bin Huang would like help from CSA to promote event. We had helped with the Chinese New Year last year. She needs a committee of parents to help with this event. Use CSA Buzz to promote. Mission of the event needs to be clarified and we need more specific ideas of where help is needed.

Newcomers' Coffee – Caitlin O'Connor - Please come tomorrow from 9-11 am and school tour at 10:30 by Rebecca Besthoff. There are 23 new families; and already have 13 RSVP's from new families.

CSA Fair is September 18th prior to Elementary Parents Night

Online Husky Handbook Task Force – Christine Lear will schedule a meeting and will put in the news to let everyone know that we're exploring this idea.

Shilpa Goel has kits from people who have moved. A lot of people thought they had ordered kits but didn't get them.

Emily DiRocco made a motion to adjourn.
