## Dr. Wickman, Administration Update:

- Dr. Wickman reported:
- Seventh Grade Play, Fame Jr. Kevin Flavin, Dara Murphy, Laurie Eckler directors/producers. Auditions going on. Performance will be week of March $10^{\text {th }}$.
- November had great professional development opportunities NCTE Conference in Boston, in-house program too.
- Trying to put together a parent program on bullying; possibly will have the district attorney. Wanted to talk to CSA about timing and coordination of it. Late January or early February was suggested, preferably Thursdays. Publicity suggested: Buzz, CSA Newsflash.
- Band and choir concerts will be next week.
- CSA funded a grant to start a single-stream recycling program. Starting in January.
- Look at intergenerational activities done in Carlisle. Taking inventory of intergenerational opportunities. David Klein, director of COA.
- State is field-testing the PARCC (Partnership Assessment Readiness College Career), an assessment to eventually replace the MCAS. 2014 pilot testing. In 2015 schools will opt for MCAS or PARCC. In 2016 all will take PARCC.
- Carlisle is one of the towns selected to field test this assessment. 4th, 6th and 8th grade classes have been selected to take the PARCC language arts section.
Typically $50 \%$ of kids take PARCC assessment in each selected grade during first pilot year (other $50 \%$ take MCAS). No results will be shared for PARCC during first pilot year. Dr. Wickman has petitioned the State to ask if all kids in those grades in Carlisle take the PARCC to avoid a split in disclosed scores (MCAS vs. PARCC).
